Jannette's vision for her juvenile court school students means understanding that we treat every student as a student who has the right and ability to learn with our support, guidance, and knowledge of their unique, individualized educational needs. An effort that Jannette is most proud of is being awarded approximately \$10,000 for a Unique Projects Grant. This allowed her and her team to purchase backpacks and fill them with school supplies for Alan M. Crogan Youth and Treatment Center probation program graduates so they can continue their education

fully prepared. Jannette was a co-creator of the RCOE Alternative Education Suicide Prevention Policy. She also was the creator of the RCOE Alternative Education Transition Policy and documents for juvenile court school students in response to AB2276. Through partnerships with UC Riverside Extension and Riverside City College, Jannette and team were able to create a Dual Enrollment CTE program and offer course enrollments for juvenile court school students. Jannette is recognized by colleagues for her ability to restore the self-confidence and strength of students who have experienced multiple social-emotional and academic challenges in their lives by prioritizing the future over the past and embracing a growth mindset. As an outstanding principal, and with no hesitation, Jannette takes on responsibilities with intense commitment and dedication. Daniel believes strongly that children cannot learn if they do not eat and that equity in the cafeteria is just as important as equity in the classroom. This is his fundamental and core belief that forms every decision and every action within nutrition services. Job number one for Daniel and his department is ensuring that children walk through the school gates, grab breakfast, and head to classrooms with their stomachs full and ready to learn. He created a farm to school program with local farmers when it was becoming more difficult to procure supplies for meals.

This helped mitigate potential losses for farms while successfully addressing supply chain issues. He acquired community eligibility for 18 schools which removed barriers for students and provided them access to free lunch. This achievement also reduced student lunch debt by over \$100,000. Daniel is an icon in Desert Sands Unified School District and is known for his professional demeanor and innovative spirit. As the Director of Nutrition Services, Daniel is a team player that sets clear expectations and shows unmatched support for his department to serve healthy, nutritious meals.

Daniel's Message: Food is my passion. How lucky am I that I was able to take that passion and create a wonderful career. There is no doubt that I am blessed to be in a career that I enjoy, and that allows me to make a difference in the world to almost 27,000 children. I joined my team almost seven years ago. From day one, the staff in the kitchen made me look good. There are 170 people who understand that what they do matters. "Children cannot learn if they are hungry"— the perfect quote to explain our philosophy happened during COVID, when we closed buildings on a Friday and began serving food from parking lots on Monday. A co-worker said, "We've got this...it is what we do." I want to thank every team member- our passionate cafeteria workers, those in our central kitchen, delivery drivers, and the management team. We are united in what we do—feed children. I would like to thank Assistant Superintendent Jordan Aquino and Superintendent Scott Bailey for always listening to me champion opportunities for children as well as our incoming Superintendent, Dr. Kelly May-Vollmar. I also want to thank my friend and PIO, Mary Perry, who listens to my crazy ideas and helps to make them happen. Finally, I want to thank the most important people of all, the students of Desert Sands, my customers who welcome me on campus and give me great menu ideas and occasionally, some not-so-gentle criticism. # **Damon Bonelli**School Counselor, Bella Vista Elementary Desert Sands Unified School District

Damon is an outstanding and passionate school counselor that has demonstrated a strong determination for student wellbeing. In 2021–2022 Damon facilitated the Counseling Collaboration, which included P.E. coaches, and was the most successful and meaningful collaboration for student success that he has ever done as a school counselor. Damon also developed the Counselor Climb, an evening event for students and parents at a community rock climbing gym in which parents practice encouraging their children while they rock climb.

Damon provided support to parents and teachers during the pandemic by creating resources, contacting families for specific referrals or assistance, and helping with contacting parents of students who were not participating. He encouraged mindfulness in his social-emotional learning virtual lessons and would remind students that were having a hard time to use those mindful skills such as breathing, repeating positive affirmations, and talking to someone when feeling sad. The students at Bella Vista are always eager to see him and welcome him into their classrooms. Damon values student agency and voice, and therefore, he creates conditions for students to develop their leadership skills. We taught through the pandemic, social unrest, an election, Zoom fatigue, remote or hybrid learning, and great loss. Despite our fears, we showed up and created powerful learning experiences for our students. What we did required a level of resilience, ingenuity, and empathy that rivaled that of any CEO.
