BUSINESS AND NONINSTRUCTIONAL OPERATIONS

SUBJECT: Tobacco-Free Schools

The Governing Board recognizes the health hazards associated with smoking and the use of tobacco products, including the breathing of second-hand smoke, and desires to provide a healthy environment for students and staff.

(cf. 5131.62 - Tobacco) (cf. 6143 - Courses of Study)

Therefore, the use of tobacco products is prohibited at all times on all property and in all facilities owned, leased, and/or operated by the Riverside County Office of Education, whether indoors or out of doors; and in all vehicles owned, leased, and/or operated by the Riverside County Office of Education. This prohibition applies to all employees, students, visitors and other persons in any program or at any meeting or event on any property owned, leased, or operated by or from the Riverside County Office of Education. This prohibition shall apply at any Riverside County Office of Education sponsored program, event or activity where students are present, even if such program, event, or activity is not on property owned, leased, or operated by the Riverside County Office of Education.

Smoking means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying of any lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, pipe, tobacco, or plant product intended for inhalation, whether natural or synthetic, in any manner or form, and includes the use of an electronic smoking device that creates aerosol or vapor or of any oral smoking device for the purpose of circumventing the prohibition of smoking. (Business and Professions Code 22950.5; Education Code 48901)

Tobacco products include: (Business and Professions Code 22950.5; Education Code 48901)

- 1. Any product containing, made, or derived from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption, whether smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, or snuff
- 2. An electronic device that delivers nicotine or other vaporized liquids to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an electronic cigarette, cigar, pipe, or hookah
- 3. Any component, part, or accessory of a tobacco product, whether or not sold separately

This policy does not prohibit the use or possession of prescription products and other cessation aids that have been approved by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug Administration, such as nicotine patch or gum.

Smoking or use of any tobacco-related products and disposal of any tobacco-related waste are prohibited within 25 feet of any playground, except on a public sidewalk located within 25 feet of the playground. (Health and Safety Code 104495)
