He studied filmmaking at American University, NY Film & Video Arts, and with cinematographer Jeri Sopanen (My Dinner with Andre) and Academy Award nominated editor Paula Heredia (Unzipped!). He earned his BA in Drama at Catholic University, worked extensively as an actor in NY and LA and has taught film related courses at NYU, FIT and Santa Rosa Junior College before joining College of the Desert as an adjunct film instructor where, since 2017, he has been developing and managing the college's nascent film program.

The objective of this webinar is to teach instructors how the principles, elements, and process of creating and scripting are used to create compelling video stories. When finished, instructors will be able to create and script a short video story that they may then produce for use in education or form other purposes.

Everything is story. Everyone has a story. We are always telling stories. It's what people do. It's how we communicate most effectively. Creating stories for the purpose of communicating them through video requires an understanding of some basic elements and principles of visual storytelling. This course will focus on these and the process required to create compelling documentary style stories that can be used for educational or entertainment purposes.
