

CREATING TRAUMA-INFORMED SYSTEMS IN SCHOOLS DIGITAL ACADEMY

In partnership with Riverside Community Care, the Riverside County Foster Youth Services Coordinating Program invites you to attend the Trauma-Sensitive Schools Digital Academy. This three-month course, delivered by seasoned experts, is designed to help people working within the school systems (K–12) to understand the prevalence and impact of traumatic events on youth and why a support system such as a school is a critical area to understand and embrace trauma. The training provides a context and history of trauma in schools, what it means to be a trauma-sensitive school as well as what school personnel can do to ensure their practices and policies are trauma-informed.

Why address trauma in schools?

- Students with multiple ACEs are twice as likely to be disengaged in school
- Students who experience two or more ACEs are three times more likely to repeat a grade
- Children who experience four our more ACEs are 7 times as likely to suffer from alcoholism as an adult, and are 12 times more likely to attempt suicide
- Childhood trauma increases the risk for seven out of the ten leading causes of death in the United States

Helping Kids to Thrive

A trauma-sensitive approach in schools helps to:

- Promote feelings of physical, social, and emotional safety
- A shared understanding among staff and faculty about the impact of trauma and adversity on students
- Endow positive and culturally responsive discipline policies and practices
- Provide access to comprehensive school mental and behavioral health services
- Promote effective community collaboration to ensure safe schools and safe environments
