- Webcam sex, amateur pornography and how minors are tricked into participating.
- CSAM (child sexual abuse materials) how pedophiles find and seduce unsuspecting minors.
- Global pedophile rings and how they operate in the dark web and using bulletproof hosting.
- Indicators to watch for and how to report.
