Involvement Process

Banning Unified School District (BUSD) is continuing its efforts to obtain and increase all stakeholder input from staff, parents, students, and community members. This school year, a template was designed and distributed to stakeholders to help them with providing input on each of the goals. Electronic communication (e.g., e-mails) was available as a source for input. All available feedback was provided to the Board of Education during a special board study session held March 31, 2015. The Board of Trustees was provided 49 pages of input. Also, these items were summarized into major categories listing the

At the stakeholder input meetings, the document, "2015-16 LCAP Annual Update," was distributed including a summary of the LCAP Goals and Action/Services for each goal. In addition, the "15-18 LCAP Input" document was provided. Furthermore, information on the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) was shared – which is the state's system of Smarter Balanced Assessments.

Though this transparent process, meaningful engagement occurred through interactive discussions and written input. Stakeholders could also provide

input through electronic correspondence (e.g., e-mails) and telephone calls. All written and electronic input was compiled for each goal and by the following entities: parents; pupils; all school sites; district office/departments; committees; certificated and classified association representatives and, community members. The information gathered was reprinted specific to each of the reporting entities onto 49 pages. This input has been summarized by common themes as presented below.

COMPETITIVE SALARIES/BENEFITS: Including a plan to recruit and retain qualified and experienced personnel through competitive salaries, health/welfare benefits; guaranteed hours (e.g., bus drivers) stipends for specific disciplines, specialists, and/or programs (e.g., after school enrichment clubs-drama).

HIRING NEW POSITIONS, CONTINUING CURRENT POSITIONS, ADDING PERSONNEL

Athletics: Physical education teachers, athletic director/sports coordinator, locker room attendants, sports coordinator.

Substitute Teachers: Increase in substitutes and permanent positions. Special Education: More teachers with special education available at each site; add an adapted physical education specialist; teachers on special assignment (TOSAs).

Instructional Assistants: Health care attendants; allowance for after school hours; full-time TK/Kinder, Primary Enhancement Program (IEP); interpreters at parent/teacher meetings, transportation aides for student needs; In School Intervention (ISI) support.

Additional Classified Positions (additional time or more hours/days): Personnel to support the following: on-campus computer technology; counseling; library services; career guidance; security (School Resource Officers); pool safety; custodial; yard duty; attendance; transportation; and, human resources. Additional Certificated Positions: DI teachers; counselors, academic/curriculum coaches or intervention personnel for ELA and Math; computer teachers; GATE coordinator; AVID assistant; full-time choir and drama teachers; art teacher; teacher-librarian; dean for alternative education; assistant principals/deans to assist with safety; robotics teachers; Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support (PBIS) TOSAs; Child Welfare and Attendance (CWA) Coordinator. CLASS SIZE REDUCTION (CSR): Continue working on CSR maintain smaller class sizes. The proposed class size ranges varied significantly ranging from 20-24:1 (kindergarten) to 25-30:1 (at middle and high school levels). CURRICULUM, MATERIALS, ASSESSMENT: Including, but not limited to:

secondary history curriculum; new precalculus books; adoption of NGSS Science materials; uniform high school academic assessments; i-Ready Math; Read Naturally 6-8; curriculum books, materials, technology for art; full set of classroom textbooks except for consumables; digital curriculum; supplemental curriculum for SPED; research-based data driven curriculum for intervention program; include ELD standards into History classes.

DIFFERENT PROGRAM OFFERINGS OR EXPANSIONS: Including, but not limited to a variety of programs such as: Gifted and Talented Education (GATE); Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID); Advanced Placement (AP); Dual Immersion; athletics/sports/physical education; PIQUE, Science Technology Engineering Mathematics (STEM) lab; more foreign language classes; continue safe school ambassadors; Drafting Computer-Aided Design (CAD); more electives in Math and ELA; dedicated reading programs for struggling learners; In School Suspension (ISS); community programs such as tutoring at community center, library reading program; performing arts; Dual Immersion (Spanish, Chinese, Sign Language); life skills; Career Technical Education (CTE) courses (e.g., childhood education, cosmetology, home economics, computer programming, auto shop, and woodshop); DARE program; peer mediation; summer school for low achievers; teacher tutoring after school; student participation in running/walking clubs; career days; Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS).

FIELD TRIPS AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES: Including, but not limited to: funding for field trips to local colleges; buses for games, college fairs; money for incentive for PE; reduce club field mileage costs; sports equipment needed for student safety; more allocation for athletics.

TECHNOLOGY, MULTIMEDIA: Including, but not limited to: library furniture/technology; updated or new classroom computers, iPads, or Chromebooks; mobile charging carts; improved wireless network; more instruction on how to use chromebooks; other electronics (e.g., earphones, LCD projectors, document cameras); color printer for history/science projects and libraries; supplies (e.g., bulbs for projectors, network tools); SMART Boards; eBooks for ELA Department.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (PD): Including, but not limited to: allotment of PD days for teachers and instructional assistants; more preparation time for teachers; time for teachers to visit other classes and observe master teachers; more conference opportunities; how to work with special needs students; updated curriculum training in ELA, Integrated Math, and NGSS; English Language Development (ELD); AVID; how to prepare for emergencies

(including CPR) and security issues; bullying; organized sports for recess and lunchtime; use of technology and SMART Boards; cross training; bus driver proficiency & transportation issues; landscape and gardening management; also numerous specific trainers/trainings/conferences were listed. EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLES: Including, but not limited to: a variety of grounds equipment; carpet machines; truck equipment; gardening equipment/supplies; storage containers; utility vehicles; hauling trailers; GPS system for school transportation.

MAINTENANCE: Including, but not limited to: water filters for the schools; running water in transportation department; more/better lighting at school sites (including gym areas, parking areas) and district departments (maintenance, transportation); playgrounds brought up to safety standards; age appropriate play structures; better parking; improved ventilation for maintenance department.

SAFETY AND SECURITY: Including, but not limited to: better bus radios; functioning bus cameras; more security at sports events; unlocked front school doors but have security present before and after school; replace old equipment; adequate fencing at high school; increased hours of monitoring station; crossing guards; repair broke restroom locks; Raptor Visitor Management System; working Intercom/PA systems.

FACILITIES, REMODEL, LAND ACQUISITION: Including, but not limited to: fully functioning transportation facilities; up-to-date training rooms; modernization TK school; large auditorium for events; unsafe football field at Nicolet; upgraded restrooms at specific sites; cooling in Nicolet gym; facility for cheerleading; upgrade lockerroom facilities at Nicolet; .

CUSTODIAL, CLEANING SUPPLIES AND ENVIRONMENT FACTORS: Including, but not limited to: storage at M & O; cleaning materials (e.g., Green/Clorox wipes); hand sanitizer dispensers at District Office and school sites; school wide recycling program (paper, plastics).

SECURITY ITEMS, CAMERAS: Including, but not limited to: metal detectors at gate; handcuffs and pepper spray for security; walkie-talkies for the campus; security and yard duty uniforms; additional security cameras.

PARENT PARTICIPATION, INVOLVEMENT: Including, but not limited to: surveying parents as to their needs and how to become involved; accessible and visible parent information at sites; parent education/classes/pre-paid conferences; continue School Messenger and include text messages; incentives to encourage parent/guardian attendance (e.g., child care, raffles); parent nights for AVID and other programs; incentives to have more parents

volunteer.

WEBSITES, COMMUNICATION: Including, but not limited to updated websites with information about: parent advisory groups; athletics specific programs (e.g., adult education, English as a Second Language); and, more communication with parents through various methods (e.g., School Mobile Apps).

ALLOCATION OF FUNDS, INCENTIVES: Continue \$250 stipend but provide specifics on spending process; increased incentives for perfect attendance; refreshments at events; money/supplies for clubs, family events; community speakers; incentives for digital curriculum creation.

Annual Update:

Staff, students, parents, and community stakeholders were involved in the review of the LCAP Annual Update at several stakeholder meetings throughout the year. As data was available it was shared with stakeholders and input sought as to whether the actions were recommended to continue in the new plan. Review included expulsion, truancy, attendance, CAHSEE scores, AMAO, CELDT, and EAP data. Based on data, recommendation were made for the development of the 2015-2018 LCAP.

Annual Update:

After twenty two input sessions and culminating with a special board meeting on May 18th. The board directed the goals to stay the same and modify actions as necessary.

Goal 1: We will continue efforts to lower class size to 24:1 in grades K-3 by 2020-2021. In addition efforts are being made to reduce class size at Nicolet Middle School and Banning High School. There was also a need to add FTE periods for Athletic director at Nicolet Middle and Banning High School.

Goal 2: Investigation of Common Core ELA materials was moved forward to the 15-16 school year. There was a recommendation for additional intervention at Nicolet Middle School with the hiring of an opportunity teacher and an in school suspension teacher to reinforce our PBIS. To assist with the rollout of our student devices at the high school, there was an identified need for a Technology Instructional Specialist and an additional Technology Technician to assure all technology is working appropriately. A Coordinator of Assessment, Testing and Student Information will be hired to assure all schools are preparing for all state testing and accountability. Elementary and Middle School Summer School will be offered in the summer of 2016 to afford more opportunities for students to close the achievement gap.

Goal 3: All goals will stay the same.

Goal 4: To offer a broad course of study, BUSD wishes to continue the Chinese Dual Immersion Program to include our Middle and High School. There was great support by all stakeholders to assure that Elementary Counseling program continues as it is a vital resource for our students and parents. There is also a need for an additional counselor at Nicolet Middle School. Since 6th grade joined the middle school two years ago, there had not been an increase in counseling services to the nearly 1000 students. A Physical Education Specialist will be hired to assist our elementary schools assure that students are receiving age appropriate physical education instruction and preparing our student to perform better on the Physical Fitness Testing. The athletic programs were recognized as needing additional funds so our students can perform at their best.

Goal 5: Additional security cameras will be purchased for all schools to ensure continued safety of all students and staff. Additional school site allocations of \$10 per student were added to afford more funding as need is determined at the site. It is a desire of BUSD to hire an additional School Resource Officer to assist at Nicolet Middle School and to offer the DARE program to our elementary school sites. Network tools and training will be afforded our Information Technology Department to assure that all technology is up to date and functioning at optimal performance. Charter buses will be purchased to assist with transportation of our students to field trips and athletic events. An additional Attendance clerk will be hired to help improve attendance and decrease truancies.

Goal 6: All goals will stay the same.

In light of this, the District has an administrator on Special Assignment for Bullying prevention at all school sites. The In school suspension teacher at Nicolet will be provided additional training and materials to assist with changing student behaviors. Two bus aides will be assigned to buses as discipline becomes and ssue. Bus monitoring equipment will be installed on our buses to help improve student behavior as well as help parents know the status of the bus arrivals and departures. A visitor management system will be installed at all campuses to check in all adults visiting our schools. Additional cameras will also be purchased to continue monitoring the safety of all our students. Additional training will be provided for teachers and administrators to improve student behaviors and ultimately ower suspension and expulsion rates. The District continues to work with the city to obtain now two additional SROs for our schools to assist with safety. Drop-out rates for the high school and middle school will continue to be monitored and

addressed. Although there was a drop in overall graduation rates, ELs and special education students increased graduation rates. Inspection of the data showed that African American student graduation rates dropped by 19.2%. This is an area of

need. Struggling teachers are also included in the actions with funds allocated for the Peer Assistance Review.

Currently the demographics of the District indicate that 85% of the District's students are qualified for Free and Reduced meals. Also, 19.7% of the District's students are English Learners and 7% of our students are homeless. Due to the large group of Low Income students and English Learners, all goals and programs are designed to improve academic achievement for not only at-risk students but all students. The District is focusing on intervention strategies for at risk students while also implementing preventative measures. This allows the District to enhance services for students to be College and Career ready. In addition the expenditures are focused on:

- 1. Ensuring the quality of educational experiences at all grade levels in order to increase the number of high school graduates with options for opportunities in the College and/or Career of their choice.
- 2. Parent engagement and communication is a focus for the District and all school sites.
- 3. School safety is a priority and many expenditures are related to bus safety, bully prevention, alternatives to suspension and maintaining facilities in good repair.
- 4. New curriculum has been purchased in recent years for mathematics K-12 and ELA K-8; continuous professional development is integral for teachers to improve their craft.
- 5. For the 2016-2017 school year, school sites will be monitored on the implementation of the LCAP goals by reviewing the school site plans and progress during monthly principal meetings.

The expenditures are focused on:

- 1. Increasing the quality of the educational experience for all students in Banning Unified School District. The educational experience will be enhanced by the implementation of AVID District wide. The AVID program is now available for all students TK-12. Professional development focusing on research based instructional strategies are reinforced by ELD Specialists, ELA Specialist, and the Technology Specialist through monthly workshops with teachers. The Chrome book Initiative at Banning High School is now in its second year. Teachers are adapting their lessons utilizing technology on a day today basis. There will be a focus on digital curriculum and preparing our students for the College and/or Career of their choosing. Additional on-line CTE courses are being investigated for all secondary high school students. In addition to program enhancements, there is also a focus on intervention TK-12. There are now intervention teachers at all elementary and middle schoolsl.
- 2. All stakeholders have had voice in the planning of the LCAP. Additional focus will be with the sharing of interim data (eg. suspension rates, attendance rates, course enrollments). Data will be periodically shared with community, staff, the Board, principals, parents and collective bargaining units. Sharing of information will occur at parent meetings, Board meetings, scheduled meetings with principals and collective bargaining units.
- 3. School climate will be improved by providing a school environment where all students and staff feel safe. BUSD will continue implementation of PBIS and Boystown curriculum. There is a focus on changing student behavior by focusing on positive behavior reinforcement and teaching students how to handle different and difficult situations. In addition, to changing behaviors, there is a continued focus to maintain site facilities to ensure the safety for all stakeholders. A continued focus on maintaining site facilities in good repair will increase community pride and connectedness with schools.

The proportionality percentage for increased or improved services is reflected in providing extra monitoring, supports, and intervention opportunities for low income, foster youth, and English Learner students. With a variety of staffing and programs, BUSD provides training, support, and guidance from the District to the individual classroom in order to target the unique needs of significant student subgroups. Although a majority of professional development trainings are focused on supporting teachers on implementation of the Common Core State Standards, we will also address the achievement gap of our significant subgroup of students. With the new state measures, these needs will be addressed to ensure student engagement is at its highest level.

Banning Unified focused on increasing services to low income, foster youth, and English Learner students with the following:

Class size reduction is a continued focus not only for grades TK-3 but also for the middle school. Class sizes are being lowered to 24:1 for the 2016-2017 school year. Class sizes at Nicolet Middle and Banning High School are being lowered to 30:1. Class sizes are being lowered so that teachers will be able to more effectively differentiate their instruction to meet the academic needs of all students. Intervention teachers were hired for grades TK-8 to assist with struggling students. These teachers were provided supplemental materials to help close the achievement gap of our unduplicated students. Additional intervention teachers were hired to offer self contained instruction grades TK-8 for those students with behavior/academic challenges. Instructional aide positions were made available for all TK/K classes. Instructional aides assisted teachers for three hours and provided an additional intervention source for students to obtain academic success. An instructional technology technician was hired to assist with the increasing use of technology at BUSD. Supplementary ELA materials for grades TK-8 were bought to bridge the old standards to the Common Core State Standards. English learners are being provided with extra support at the high school level to assure that they will graduate and be college or career ready. We redesignated 62 students in 2016, this is less than the previous year because of the CAASPP results. An extra counselor was hired at BHS to work with English Learners, low income students and foster youth. Moreover to enhance the elective program at Nicolet Middle School and encourage more student engagement choir and drama were added. Facilities are being maintained to assure a safe and clean environment for all students. Parent involvement is key to student achievement. In order to increase parent involvement and awareness of District events we have publicized our District meetings at local businesses, the public library, and City Hall . Also, there are new parent meetings called Coffee Sessions
