A compilation of stakeholder input was categorized by the following groups: parents; pupils; all school sites; district office staff; certificated and classified association representatives; and, community members.

SCHOOL SITE STAFF INPUT

The greatest areas of concern from school site staff continued to focus on intervention for struggling students in ELA and Math, common core alignment, instructional materials, class size reduction across all grade levels, additional computer devices for students along with technological support for teachers, and hiring of highly qualified teachers and specialists (e.g. service providers for special education and counselors).

Other areas of priority shared consistently across school sites included, but not limited to, permanent substitute teachers, continued allocation for classroom supplies, more course options (e.g. electives) and additional technical support for curriculum and instruction. Regarding school climate, a continued need appeared in the areas of outreach consultants, improved security and safety through additional cameras, improved facilities, ground repairs, and a more consistent implementation of Positive Behavioral Intervention of Support (PBIS).

PRINCIPAL INPUT

Monthly principal meetings were held with District cabinet to progressively implement the identified Actions/Services in attainment of the LCAP Goals. Through this process, it was determined which areas required continued attention. Many of these areas validated those shared by staff, parents, and community members at the stakeholder input meetings. Some of the specific priorities included but were not limited to: safety and security activities (e.g. more security cameras, window protections against theft, school resource officer at middle school); additional instructional coaches and instructional and administrative support and materials for ELA and Math; class sets of chrome books and more smart boards; technological support for teachers; additional counselors; permanent substitute teachers; late bus for academic/sports; and outreach consultant to assist with attendance issues.

PARENT INPUT

Monthly Principal Meetings

At the parent input sessions, parent and community members supported the Actions/Services identified as priorities in the LCAP. Parents shared the need for: continued Dual Immersion programs; highly qualified (not substitute) instructional assistants; more collaboration between general and special education programs; more chrome books for student use; and, more safety and security measures.

PUPIL INPUT

Pupil input sessions were held at the middle and high school levels. Input was very specific and supported the Services/Activities outlined in each LCAP Goal. The students validated many of the same priorities as staff and parents shared during their stakeholder meetings. Numerous items were identified related to maintenance and repairs of common areas and facilities as well as safety. Regarding conditions of learning, students indicated priorities regarding highly qualified teachers, more instructional materials and computers, access to a broader course of study including Dual Immersion programs, more advanced classes, and expanded elective offerings. More athletic programs, sports activities, and field trips were suggested.

Annual Update:

Staff, students, parents, and community stakeholders were involved in the review of the LCAP Annual Update at several stakeholder meetings throughout the year. As data was available it was shared with stakeholders and input sought as to whether the actions were recommended to continue in the new plan. Review included expulsion, truancy, attendance, CAHSEE scores, AMAO, CELDT, and EAP data. Based on data, recommendation were made for the development of the 2015-2018 LCAP.

Annual Update:

After twenty two input sessions and culminating with a special board meeting on May 18th. The board directed the goals to stay the same and modify actions as necessary.

Goal 1: We will continue efforts to lower class size to 24:1 in grades K-3 by 2020-2021. In addition efforts are being made to reduce class size at Nicolet Middle School and Banning High School. There was also a need to add FTE periods for Athletic director at Nicolet Middle and Banning High School.

Goal 2: Investigation of Common Core ELA materials was moved forward to the 15-16 school year. There was a recommendation for additional intervention at Nicolet Middle School with the hiring of an opportunity teacher and an in school suspension teacher to reinforce our PBIS. To assist with the rollout of our student devices at the high school, there was an identified need for a Technology Instructional Specialist and an additional Technology Technician to assure all technology is working appropriately. A Coordinator of Assessment,

Testing and Student Information will be hired to assure all schools are preparing for all state testing and accountability. Elementary and Middle School Summer School will be offered in the summer of 2016 to afford more opportunities for students to close the achievement gap.

Goal 3: All goals will stay the same.

Goal 4: To offer a broad course of study, BUSD wishes to continue the Chinese Dual Immersion Program to include our Middle and High School. There was great support by all stakeholders to assure that Elementary Counseling program continues as it is a vital resource for our students and parents. There is also a need for an additional counselor at Nicolet Middle School. Since 6th grade joined the middle school two years ago, there had not been an increase in counseling services to the nearly 1000 students. A Physical Education Specialist will be hired to assist our elementary schools assure that students are receiving age appropriate physical education instruction and preparing our student to perform better on the Physical Fitness Testing. The athletic programs were recognized as needing additional funds so our students can perform at their best.

Goal 5: Additional security cameras will be purchased for all schools to ensure continued safety of all students and staff. Additional school site allocations of \$10 per student were added to afford more funding as need is determined at the site. It is a desire of BUSD to hire an additional School Resource Officer to assist at Nicolet Middle School and to offer the DARE program to our elementary school sites. Network tools and training will be afforded our Information Technology Department to assure that all technology is up to date and functioning at optimal performance. Charter buses will be purchased to assist with transportation of our students to field trips and athletic events. An additional Attendance clerk will be hired to help improve attendance and decrease truancies.

District office will monitor the chronic absentee list and work towards improvement with all staff.

With the implementation of PBIS, there will be a reduction of 8% in the suspension rates for the District and each school site.

Each school will reduce its truancy rate by 5% each year by calling parents to clear absences and utilizing the BUSD Outreach Consultant, attendance clerks, counselors, and administration to make parent phone calls to encourage improved attendance.

The BUSD will increase the graduation rate by 5% by offering credit recovery, summer school, interventions, increase in pathway offerings, monitoring of attendance, enrollment in dual enrollment and AP classes, college and career readiness counseling, and monitoring of attendance.

Graduation rates for Special Education students will increase by 5%.

4. During the 2014-2015 school year, an ELA adoption committee will be formed to make a recommendation to purchase ELA Common Core aligned instructional materials K-12 for the 2015-2016 school year. Professional development will be provided to all teachers of English Language Arts K-12 in the 2015-2016 school year.

- 5. During the 2013-2014 school year, teachers shared the need to collaborate amongst their grade-level colleagues across the District. Grade level collaborations will help improve instructional practices as they implement Common Core State Standards. In 2014-2017, SMART Wednesday agendas and meeting minutes will be kept to monitor collaboration efforts of all grade level K-5.
- 6. As reported by secondary teacher input, there is a need for the secondary schools (New Horizons High, Banning High, and Nicolet Middle School) to collaborate and work to improve instruction. Meeting agendas and minutes will be kept to monitor the efforts of collaboration in grades 6-12.
- 7. Common Core aligned benchmark exams and practice

Because we did not have practice performance tasks prior to 2013-14, the data obtained during the 2014-15 school year will be used as baseline data.

- 4. The state has not released the state adopted list of materials for English Language Arts, so an adoption committee was not formed. Elementary sites continued to use SRA Imagine It. i-Ready teacher toolbox, an online resource, was used to supplement our current adoption. Banning High School ELA teachers worked throughout the school year meeting regularly to develop resources and ELA materials that will be used with the 2015-2016 school-wide implementation of student chrome books. Semester 1 materials have been completed with semester 2 materials anticipated to be completed by June 2015. This collaboration also included the expansion of the English, Reading, Writing, Course (ERWC) materials to include grades 9-11. All curriculum is aligned with Common Core State Standards. Professional development TK-12 was not provided because an adoption of ELA did not occur.
- 5. Elementary grade level collaboration was not completed beyond the individual school sites. Grade level collaboration occurred during the first three months of the school year, however, it was determined that school sites needed to collaborate individually for the remainder of the 2014-15 school year. Each school site needed to come to consensus on best practices and data analysis before collaborating as a district.
- 6. Banning High School teachers met every Thursday, either as a department or cross curricular teams discussing engagement strategies, classroom management, common core issues, and analysis of benchmark data. There was also an RCOE contract with ELA and math content specialists who met with the departments monthly to plan, model lessons, and provide professional learning walks. This collaboration did not occur with all secondary sites. Collaboration needs were markedly different amongst New Horizons, Banning High, and Nicolet Middle. It was

performance tasks were utilized from Key Data Systems. The exams were administered first, second and third quarter for the 2013-2014 school year. There was one performance task administered during the 2013-2014 school year. Student data will be used as baseline data for 2014-2015 school year. There will be an increase of proficiency by 5% on the benchmark exams and an increase of proficiency by 5% on the performance tasks.

- 8. For the 2014-2017 school years the specialists will perform department or grade-level presentations at least four times a year, five presentations to whole staff, and keep a log to monitor activities during the school year.
- 9. Teacher and student input will be sought to determine the level of effectiveness of the multi-disciplinary content lessons. Revisions of the lessons will be made after input.
- 10. A posting for the three permanent substitute teacher positions will be flown by June 30, 2014. A list of potential substitutes will be generated for interviews and hiring for the 2014-2015 school year.
- 11. During the stakeholders input sessions, there was a need noted for intervention teachers in grades K-12. Academic achievement of at-risk students will be monitored for effectiveness of the intervention teachers. Use of intervention materials will be reviewed by administrators and intervention teachers to evaluate their effectiveness. The library at Coombs Alternative Education will be open for more hours and a student sign in sheet will determine the level of usage by students.
- 12. A posting will be advertised for seventeen Transitional Kindergarten/Kindergarten (TK/K) instructional aides to be hired for the 2014-2015 school year. Academic achievement of BUSD's TK/K students will be monitored for the effectiveness of the instructional aides.
- 13. Student achievement data will be monitored to assure that students placed in the intervention classrooms are having more success than in the regular classroom. District benchmark data and classroom assessment will be used to determine success.

- 9. A survey was not completed due to the lack of personnel within district office departments.
- 10. Three permanent substitutes were not hired due to the lack of personnel within district office departments.
- 11. Four elementary intervention teachers were hired. Six periods of intervention were offered at Nicolet for English and Math. Banning High School did not utilize the six periods of intervention.
- 12. Substitutes have been in the majority of the aide positions. These positions will be flown and hired after June 30, 2015.
- 13. Data still needs to be collected to determine the effectiveness of the intervention classes. Initial feedback from the teachers

- 15. Teacher and student surveys will be completed to determine the functionality of technology at all sites and how the technology is used by teachers and students.
- 16. Parent, teacher, and student surveys will be conducted to evaluate how technology is being used in the classroom.
- 17. The Integrated Adoption Committee will make recommendations for Integrated Mathematics for students in grades 6-12. Achievement scores will be monitored for appropriate implementation of Integrated Math.

- 15. A student survey was not developed due to the lack of personnel within district office departments. Informal teacher data was gathered through staff meetings and shared by principals at administrative meetings. Data showed that some technology did not work in certain locations and some devices were defective.
- 16.Teacher and student surveys were not developed due to the lack of personnel within district office departments.An online parent survey was developed and sent to parents. Data needs to be reviewed by the administrative team.
- 17. The Integrated Math adoption committee is currently still meeting.
- 18. IEP data was reviewed to determine educational benefit and students making progress towards goals. Data demonstrated that students are receiving educational benefits and making progress towards or attaining goals as outlined in their IEP.

The District has adopted and purchased the Math standards aligned instructional materials as well as partial procurement of services, and expenditures will be the English Language Arts (ELA) common core aligned materials. Some of the ELA materials will be changing with new State made as a result of reviewing past adoptions for specific grade levels. Once available, these new materials will be purchased. The District textbook adoption.

> Teacher professional development through SMART Wednesdays appeared to be very beneficial to teachers and parent supported, especially the opportunity for teachers to collaborate. Vertical articulation was started across the middle and secondary levels but still need full implementation. Also, conducting quarterly benchmark exams and quarterly practice performance tasks is a work in progress and needs to be consistently administered across school sites.

Although, the ELA Specialist and ELD Specialists were hired, it was difficult to fill the Math Instructional Specialist due to single subject credential requirement. The middle school used period intervention from existing teachers. While the high school did not use the intervention periods offered.

Teacher substitutes were made available as needed, but the District did not hire permanent substitutes which will be priority in 2015-16. Furthermore, the instructional assistants were made available to assist in the TK and Kindergarten classes, but these were substitute not permanent positions. The District has worked hard to create a pool of qualified candidates and plan to hire permanent aides in 2015-16.

Realignment of the technology position in order to offer a high competitive salary has been done and recruitment is in process. Many new computers, especially chrome books were purchased. Additional funds will be allocated in 2015-16 to accommodate a lower student ratio per computer, especially at the high school level.

- 4. Truancy letters are being reviewed to determine the percentage of students who have improved their attendance. Ongoing intervention will be continued. Referral data are being reviewed to determine the percentage decrease of discipline referrals. For the 2014-15 school year ADA percentages are: Cabazon 93.906%, Central 95.542%, Hemmerling 94.207%, Hoffer 93.457%, Nicolet 94.143%, Banning High 93.277%, Alternative Education 94.038%. Data from the 2013-14 school year is not readily available as an overall percentage. Further data review will be required for a comparison.
- 5. Monthly perfect attendance reports for the 2014-15 school year have been compiled and analyzed from Illuminate. The average annual positive attendance at Nicolet Middle School was reported at 20.57% and 18.57% at Banning High School. The percentage increase of annual perfect attendance will be compared in 2015-16 on a monthly basis to the prior school year's figures. The ADA improved from prior school year by 2 percent. The ADA information has been made available on monthly Board reports.
- 6. A pre and post School-wide Evaluation Tool (SET), a summative evaluation tool to access critical features of schoolwide behavior support, was administered to school staff as part of determining the current status as the implementation of PBIS. For the middle and high school levels, there were positive behavioral and safety targets at approximately 60%. During the LCAP parent input session, parents validated that their children feel safer at the school sites. The post evaluation noted that all schools were performing at or above 50% fidelity of implementation. This means that all schools are at the expected level of PBIS implementation. Cabazon, Hemmerling, Hoffer, and New Horizons are at 75-80% of implementation. A post parent survey still needs to be completed now that we have data to share with parents. For the 2012-13 school year there were 3,423 discipline referrals broken down by school: BHS 1.182: NHHS 152: Nicolet 1,221; Cabazon 272; Central 86; Hemmerling 167; and Hoffer 343. For the 2013-14 school year there were 2,954 discipline referrals broken down by school: BHS 605; NHHS 7; Nicolet 2,087; Cabazon 18; Central 12; Hemmerling 32; and Hoffer 193. The BUSD decreased the amount of office referrals by approximately 14%. The number of office referral data was not available for the 2013-14 school year.

- 14. A reduction by 5% of discipline referrals will be a result of the additional security at Nicolet Middle School and Banning High School. Parent and student surveys will reflect an increase in feeling safe at school.
- 15. A review of graduation rates for Special Education students will be reviewed annually.

- 7. Using Illuminate, the District's discipline events for August 2012 through May 2013 were compiled and reviewed. Comparative information is in the process of being aggregated and will be analyzed for the 2014-15 school year, and generated on a monthly basis for subsequent school years. This information will be provided to each school site. Also, a draft "Progressive Discipline Matrix" has been developed by a District Discipline Committee and is being finalized to promote a district-wide culture of proactive intervention and consistent consequences grounded in evidence-based practices. There were 95 major incidents at BHS, 1.051 at Nicolet, 280 minor incidents at BHS. and 859 minor incidents at Nicolet. This establishes our baseline and will be compared with next year's data. For the 2013-14 school year BUSD had 434 off-campus suspensions and 347 inschool suspensions. School site breakdown is: BHS 112/32; Cabazon 32/3; Central 16/0; Hemmerling 20/0; Hoffer 54/125; NHHS 12/4; Nicolet 188/183. For the 2014-15 school year BUSD had 872 suspensions. School site breakdown is: BHS 138; Cabazon 3; Central 0; Hemmerling 3; Hoffer 0; NHHS 1; Nicolet 727. Further data review needs to be completed to assure accurate reporting with the data and to include off-campus suspensions and in-school suspensions.
- 8. Site administration conducted weekly walk-throughs to check the condition of facilities. A Williams inspection is also conducted annually. Although facilities appear to being good condition, further concerns were noted during the LCAP input meetings and those will be addressed in the 2015-15 school year.
- 9. Each classroom teacher was provided \$250 to enhance the climate of their classrooms. Responses were so positive from the majority of the teachers providing input at the LCAP that this allocation will be continued.
- 10. Truancy reports need to be reviewed by site staff.
- 11. Using the California Management Information system (CASEMIS), a review of graduation rates for Special Education students is conducted annually. The graduation rate for special education students for the 2014-2015 school year was 86.2% at Banning High School and 78.8% at New Horizons High School.

Multiple repairs and landscaping have been completed and the condition of facilities has been confirmed as in good condition. services, and expenditures will be Also, numerous custodial tools and supplies have been purchased. However, for continued safety and positive climate made as a result of reviewing past environments, additional funds will be allocated to purchase needed tools, maintain grounds, make any further needed repairs, and purchase additional security cameras along with securing windows for safety. Other resource commitments for 2015-16 will include an increase in personnel for maintenance and operations (e.g., custodial, groundskeeping, maintenance).

Due to the lack of personnel within the district office, an Outreach consultant was not hired. This position will be filled in 2015-16 to support school sites with issues concerning attendance and discipline. Positive attendance incentives will be continued in subsequent school years; parents voiced positive feedback on incentives and encouraged continuing these incentives.

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) was implemented at each school site with assistance from an outside consulting educational firm. Although, measurement tools indicated a significant change toward positive environments, it appears that implementation has not been consistent across sites. PBIS implementation will be continued in 2015-16 with the same consulting firm using one focus person rather than several individuals.

Tracking systems for discipline events were difficult to finalize due to transition to Illuminate, the new student system. The District will fine-tune the tracking reports and provide these to the school sites on a monthly basis for monitoring and to make recommendations for improved behavior strategies.

Parent involvement at the made as a result of reviewing past high school was very successful through the implementation of PIQUE. Forty nine parents participated at the high school. This was a very successful program and it will be continued in the 2015-2016 school year. Through the LCAP stakeholder input meetings, there was active engagement of all stakeholders, parents, teachers, students, and the community, however, formal surveys have not been completed. In 2015-16 there will be a focus on parent communication through quarterly newsletters and active parent usage of the Parent Portal in the District's student information system, Illuminate. Additional staff will be hired to help coordinate these activities. Due to the lack of personnel within the district office, an eight-hour bilingual Home School Liaison was not hired but will be hired in 2015-16 to assist with translations for parent outreach in subsequent vears.

> The Riverside County Special Education Local Plan (SELPA) has a parent Community Advisory Committee (CAC) and parent workshops. Our district has parent representation on the CAC, but we need to ensure that these opportunities are shared in a timely manner with parents of students with special needs. As the District has a high concentration of Foster Youth, English Learners, Low income students, we will concentrate on addressing the needs of these populations through the committee process of involved parents. One highlight was the implementation of our Coffee Sessions/Tazitas de Café at the elementary school sites. This was another opportunity for parent to participate and become active leaders as parent liaisons. Meetings were held monthly and began with district and site staff running the meetings. As the meetings progressed, staff trained parents to run the meetings, set the agenda, and get parent participation. District meetings were advertised in local churches,

small businesses, public library, and the Chamber of Commerce.

Currently the demographics of the District indicate that 88% of the District's students are qualified for Free and Reduced meals. Also, 18% of the District's students are English Learners and 8% of our students are homeless. Due to the large group of Low Income students and English Learners, all goals and programs are designed to improve academic achievement for not only at-risk students but all students. The District is focusing on intervention strategies for at risk students while also implementing preventative measures. This allows the District to enhance services for students to be College and Career ready. In addition the expenditures are focused on:

- 1. Ensuring the quality of educational experiences at all grade levels in order to increase the number of high school graduates with options for opportunities in the College and/or Career of their choice.
- 2. Offering multiple opportunities and experiences for the community to be involved in setting District and school priorities.
- 3. Modernizing school facilities and creating a positive school climate.
- 4. Empowering sites to set their priorities to best meet the needs of their students.
- 5. For the 2015-2016 school year, school sites will be monitored on the implementation of the LCAP goals by reviewing the school site plans during monthly principal meetings.

The expenditures are focused on:

- 1. Increasing the quality of the educational experience for all students in Banning Unified School District. The educational experience will be enhanced by the implementation of AVID District wide. The AVID program is now available for all students TK-12. Professional development focusing on research based instructional strategies are reinforced by ELD Specialists, ELA Specialist, and the Technology Specialist through monthly workshops with teachers. There is the Chrome book Initiative at Banning High School, where all students will receive Chrome books in the fall 2015. There will be a focus on digital curriculum and preparing our students for the College and/or Career of their choosing. An additional Public Safety pathway is now available for high school students. In addition to program enhancements, there is also a focus on intervention TK-12. There are now intervention teachers at all elementary and middle schools and our comprehensive high school.
- 2. All stakeholders have had voice in the planning of the LCAP. Additional focus will be with the sharing of interim data (eg. suspension rates, attendance rates, course enrollments). Data will be periodically shared with community, staff, the Board, principals, parents and collective bargaining units. Sharing of information will occur at parent meetings, Board meetings, scheduled meetings with principals and collective bargaining units.
- 3. School climate will be improved by providing a school environment where all students and staff feel safe. BUSD will continue implementation of PBIS and Boystown curriculum. There is a focus on changing student behavior by focusing on positive behavior reinforcement and teaching students how to handle different and difficult situations. In addition, to changing behaviors, there is a continued focus to maintain site facilities to ensure the safety for all stakeholders. A continued focus on maintaining site facilities in good repair will increase community pride and connectedness with schools.

The proportionality percentage for increased or improved services is reflected in providing extra monitoring, supports, and intervention opportunities for low income, foster youth, and English Learner students. With a variety of staffing and programs, BUSD provides training, support, and guidance from the District to the individual classroom in order to target the unique needs of significant student subgroups. Although a majority of professional development trainings are focused on supporting teachers on implementation of the Common Core State Standards, we will also address the achievement gap of our significant subgroup of students. With the new state measures, these needs will be addressed to ensure student engagement is at its highest level.

Banning Unified focused on increasing services to low income, foster youth, and English Learner students with the following:

Class size reduction is a continued focus not only for grades TK-3 but also for the middle school. Class sizes are being lowered to 26:1 for the 2015-2016 school year. We are advancing each year towards the goal of 24:1 by 2020-2021 for grades TK-3. Class sizes at Banning High School are being lowered to 30:1. Class sizes are being lowered so that teachers will be able to more effectively differentiate their instruction to meet the academic needs of all students. Intervention teachers were hired for grades TK-8 to assist with struggling students. These teachers were provided supplemental materials to help close the achievement gap of our unduplicated students. Additional intervention teachers were hired to offer self contained instruction grades TK-8 for those students with behavior/academic challenges. Instructional aide positions were made available for all TK/K classes. Instructional aides assisted teachers for three hours and provided an additional intervention source for students to obtain academic success. An instructional technology technician was hired to assist with the increasing use of technology at BUSD. Additional library hours were made available for students to have access to technology, curriculum and library resources. Supplementary ELA materials for grades TK-8 were bought to bridge the old standards to the Common Core State Standards. English learners are being provided with extra support at the high school level to assure that they will graduate and be college or career ready. We redesignated 36 student from the English Learners Program at Banning High School in 2015. The most as of yet. Overall, redesignations have increased across the district. The number of intermediate students is significantly decreasing. An extra counselor was hired at BHS to work with English Learners, low income students and foster youth. Moreover to enhance the elective program at Nicolet Middle School and encourage more student engagement choir and drama were added. Facilities are being maintained to assure a safe
