Innovative Horizons provided frequent updates on the LCAP during our regularly scheduled School Advisory Council (SAC) meetings. There was also a meeting for public input on May 26, 2016 to review the LCAP process, and provide input on goals. Stakeholder groups have received timely information (qualitative/quantitative) to inform LCAP goal setting. Such information included student attendance and suspension rates, assessment data, CELDT data, and free/reduced lunch rates. Groups were also engaged in collaborative conversations regarding state priorities relating to LCAP, and suggestions for addressing those priorities at Innovative Horizons.

To meet statutory requirements for stakeholder engagement, including engagement with representative parents of pupils identified in Education Code section 42238.01, Innovative Horizons sought input through committee meetings (ELAC and SAC), surveys, and public forums such as Coffee with the Principal. Additionally, students were surveyed for in put on the LCAP.

Surveys revealed a desire to increase support for students. Innovative Horizons will hire two intervention teachers to provide reading support for students, as well as continue to offer Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) to promote organization, study skills, and college awareness. A number of respondents from our English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC), and from our community/parent survey, stated that they would like to see the AVID program implemented at our school.

Due to the high unduplicated student count of 94% low-income, English Learners, and foster youth, these services will be implemented school wide.

Annual Update:

LCAP goals were reviewed throughout the year with stakeholder groups, including the School Advisory Council (SAC) and English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC). SAC meetings specifically discussing and addressing the LCAP occurred on 9/4/15, 2/5/16, 4/8/16, 5/20/16, and 6/3/16. ELAC parents were engaged in LCAP conversations on 12/15/15, 2/2/16, and 4/5/16. An online survey was conducted of all stakeholders on the state priorities. Stakeholders surveyed included parents, students, and certificated and classified bargaining unit members. Survey results were used to update LCAP goals.

Annual Update:

Input from stakeholder groups was used when developing LCAP goals.

Survey results revealed that Innovative Horizons is doing a good job of meeting the needs of the students. There was a strong desire provide intervention teachers to support student achievement, provide clean and modern facilities, and provide standards aligned instructional materials.

 - (1) The unduplicated count of pupils involved in one or more incidents for which the pupil was suspended during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (2) The unduplicated count of pupils with a primary, secondary, or short-term enrollment during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (3) Divide (1) by (2).
- (f) "Expulsion rate" shall be calculated as follows:
 - (1) The unduplicated count of pupils involved in one or more incidents for which the pupil was expelled during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (2) The unduplicated count of pupils with a primary, secondary, or short-term enrollment during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (3) Divide (1) by (2).
