## **2022-2023 Riverside County Four-Year Cohort Graduation, Cohort Dropout, A-G Completion, and State Seal of Biliteracy Rates**

Graduation and dropout rates for counties, districts, and schools across California are calculated based on four-year cohort information using the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System (CALPADS). This is the fourteenth time that four-year cohort information has been collected since 2009-2010. To display 14-year historical data, this report includes students from all schools, charter and non-charter schools, in California.

The four-year cohort is based on the number of students who enter grade 9 for the first time adjusted by adding into the cohort any student who transfers in later during grade 9 or during the next three years and subtracting any student from the cohort who transfers out, emigrates to another country, transfers to a prison or juvenile facility, or dies during that same period. The four-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (ACGR) is the number of students who graduate from high school in four years with a regular high school diploma divided by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the graduating class. Cohort dropout rate reflects the percent of **four-year cohort students** who: (1) do not graduate with a regular high school diploma, (2) do not otherwise complete high school, or (3) are not still enrolled as a “fifth-year senior.”

In 2016-2017, the California Department of Education (CDE) made several changes to the business rules and methodology for calculating the four-year ACGR pursuant to new federal guidance and audit recommendations from the U.S. Department of Inspector General. Two of the most significant changes are: (1) no longer allowing students transferring to adult education or community college to be removed from the cohort; and (2) no longer counting students exiting with an adult education high school diploma as regular high school graduates. The impact on county, district, and school graduation and/or dropout rates varies depending on how often students were exited as transferring to an adult education program during the cohort period, or how many students completed with an adult education high school diploma. In addition, students who pass the California High School Proficiency Exam (CHSPE) are no longer considered as regular high school graduates.

The CDE has started to release A-G completion and State Seal of Biliteracy information for four-year cohort graduates since 2016-2017. In this report, A-G completion rate reflects the percent of **four-year cohort graduates** who have successfully completed the minimum course requirements for entry into the (UC) or (CSU) system. State Seal of Biliteracy rate reflects the percent of **four-year cohort graduates** who, in accordance with Education Code Section 51460(a), attained a high level of proficiency in one or more languages (including American Sign Language), in addition to English and earned the State Seal of Biliteracy. Both A-G completion and State Seal of Biliteracy are currently included in the California School Dashboard and used as College/Career Indicator (CCI) measures.

## Executive Summary

### 1. County Cohort Graduation and Dropout Rates (All Schools): Pages 1-14

- In Riverside County, 91.4 percent (31,154 out of 34,085) of students who started high school in 2019 graduated with their class in 2023; a slight decrease from 92.2 percent (31,155 out of 33,791) last year. The 2023 Riverside County graduation rate was **the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest** among the largest ten counties in California. The county's graduation rate has increased from 77.7 percent in 2010 to 91.4 percent in 2023 (see pages 1-3).
- The number of 2023 dropouts in Riverside County totaled 1,704, an increase from 1,487 in 2022. The dropout rate, as a result, increased from 4.4 percent in 2022 to 5.0 percent in 2023. The 2023 Riverside County dropout rate was **the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest** among the largest ten counties in California. The county's dropout rate has decreased from 15.1 percent in 2010 to 5.0 percent in 2023 (see pages 4-6).
- Graduation rates show that all student groups have demonstrated improvement since 2010. However, a gap in graduation rates still persists between Hispanic students (90.5%), African American students (90.8%), socioeconomically disadvantaged students (90.4%), American/Alaska Indian students (88.4%), homeless youth students (82.8%), students with disabilities (78.9%), migrant education students (81.9%), English learners (82.5%), or foster youth students (71.0%) and their White peers (93.1%). In addition, there is a notable difference between female students (93.9%) and male students (89.0%). From 2022 to 2023, the graduation rate for migrant education students has decreased by 6.7 percentage points, homeless youth students have decreased by 1.5 percentage points, and foster youth have reduced by 1.1 percentage points (see pages 7-10).
- There has been a dip in the dropout rate for each student group since 2010. The highest dropout rates were reported for foster youth students (19.3%), homeless youth students (12.0%), English learners (10.9%), migrant education students (10.1%), and students with disabilities (7.9%), according to the 2023 data. The dropout rate of male students (6.4%) was twice as high as that of female students (3.5%) (see pages 11-14).

### 2. District Cohort Graduation and Dropout Rates (All Schools): Pages 15-18

- 15 out of 18 (83%) districts in Riverside County have a higher 2023 graduation rate than the state average (89.1%). The top 6 districts with the highest 2023 graduation rates are Murrieta Valley Unified (96.7%), Alvord Unified (94.9%), Corona-Norco Unified (94.9%), Jurupa Unified (94.1%), Desert Sands Unified (93.8%), and Temecula Valley Unified (93.8%).
- 12 out of 18 (67%) districts in Riverside County have a lower 2023 dropout rate than the state average (6.5%). The top five districts with the lowest 2023 dropout rates are Murrieta Valley Unified (1.2%), Corona-Norco Unified (1.8%), Lake Elsinore Unified (2.0%), Temecula Valley Unified (2.1%), and Desert Sands Unified (2.3%).

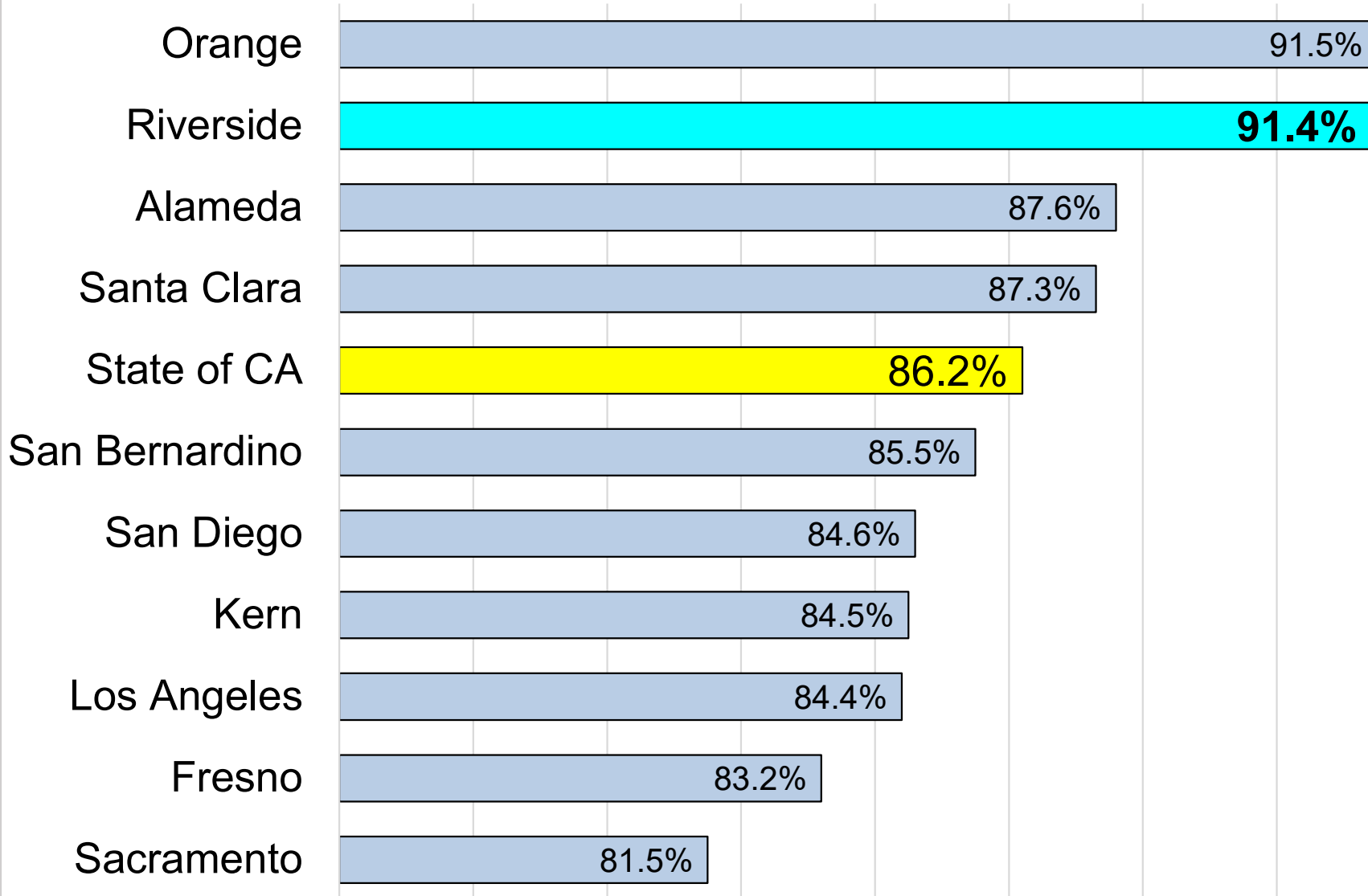
### **3. County A-G Completion and State Seal of Biliteracy Rates (All Schools): Pages 19-24**

- Half of the four-year cohort graduates in Riverside County met requirements for admission to either the UC and/or CSU. The 2023 A-G completion rate in Riverside County was 50.0%, the 6<sup>th</sup> highest among the largest 10 counties in California. In 2023, 15,587 (50.0%) four-year cohort graduates completed UC/CSU required courses, as compared to 14,900 (47.8%) four-year cohort graduates in 2022 (see pages 19-21).
- The 2023 State Seal of Biliteracy rate for four-year cohort graduates in Riverside County was 8.5%, the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest among the largest 10 counties in California. In 2023 2,663 (8.5%) four-year cohort graduates earned the State Seal of Biliteracy, increased from 2,580 (8.3%) in 2022 (see pages 19-21).
- There are significant differences among student groups on 2023 A-G completion rates (see pages 22-24).
  - Ethnicity comparison: Asian (76.3%) vs. White (59.4%) vs. Hispanic (45.3%) vs. African American (43.3%)
  - Program comparison: Socioeconomically disadvantaged students (44.9%) vs. migrant education students (38.2%) vs. homeless youth students (29.6%) vs. English learners (22.8%) vs. foster youth students (19.2%) vs. students with disabilities (15.7%)
  - Gender comparison: female (57.0%) vs. male (43.0%)
- There are also notable differences among student groups on 2023 State Seal of Biliteracy rates (see pages 22-24).
  - Ethnicity comparison: Asian (13.0%) vs. Hispanic (10.2%) vs. White (5.4 %) vs. African American (1.9%)
  - Program comparison: migrant education students (9.7%) vs. socioeconomically disadvantaged students (8.4%) vs. homeless youth students (4.7%) vs. English learners (2.8%) vs. foster youth students (1.4%) vs. students with disabilities (0.7%)
  - Gender comparison: female (11.4%) vs. male (5.7%)

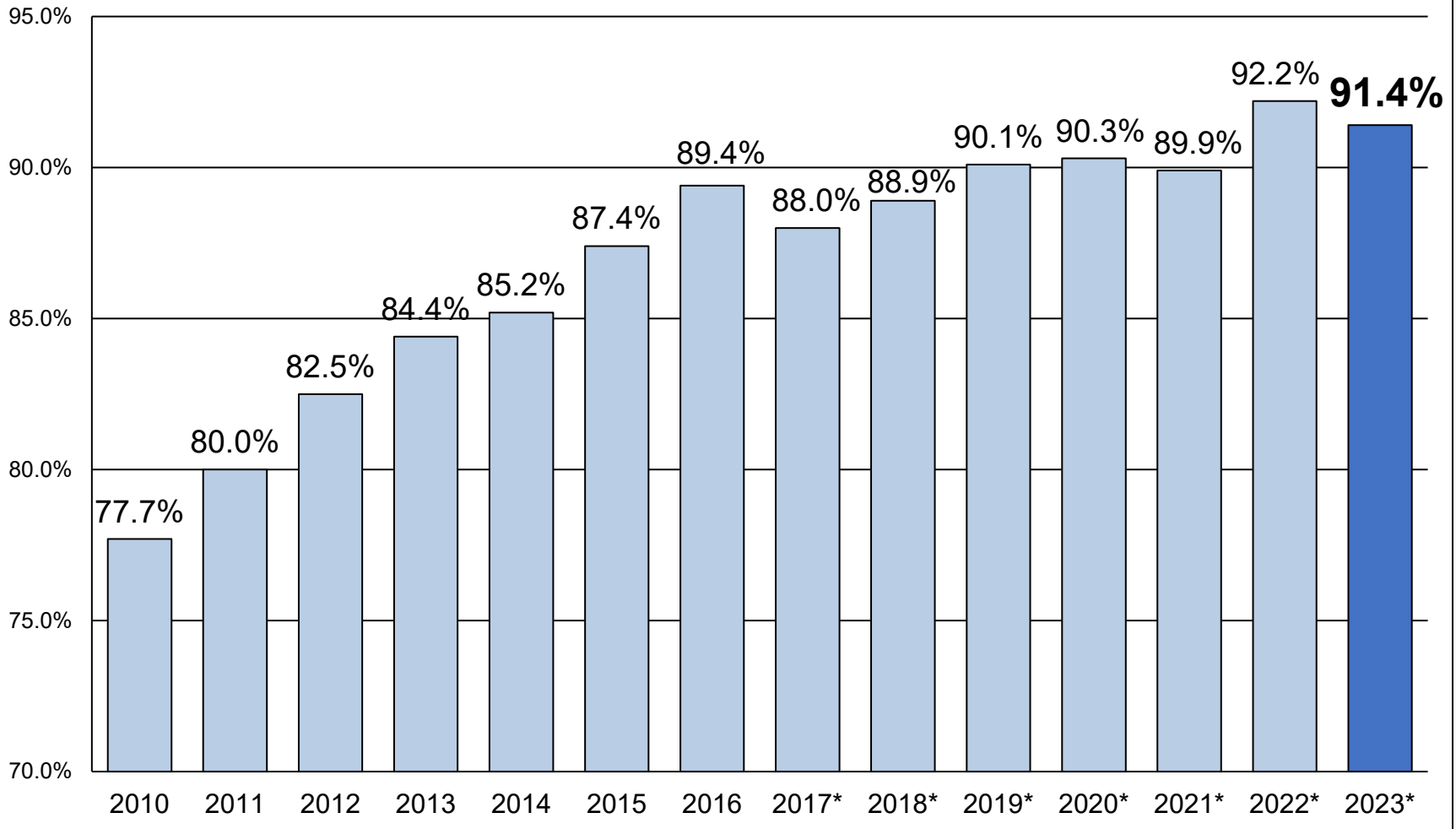
### **4. District A-G Completion and State Seal of Biliteracy Rates (All Schools): Pages 25-27**

- 6 out of 18 (33%) districts in Riverside County have a higher 2023 a-g completion rate than the state average (51.8%). The top 5 districts with the highest 2023 A-G completion rates are Temecula Valley Unified (71.5%), Val Verde Unified (59.4%), Murrieta Valley Unified (59.0%), Desert Sands Unified (54.7%), and Riverside Unified (54.7%).
- 1 out of 18 (6%) districts in Riverside County have a higher 2023 State Seal of Biliteracy rate than the state average (12.8%). The district with highest 2023 State Seal of Biliteracy rate is Palm Springs Unified (13.8%).

# 2010-2023 Cohort Graduation Rates Riverside County



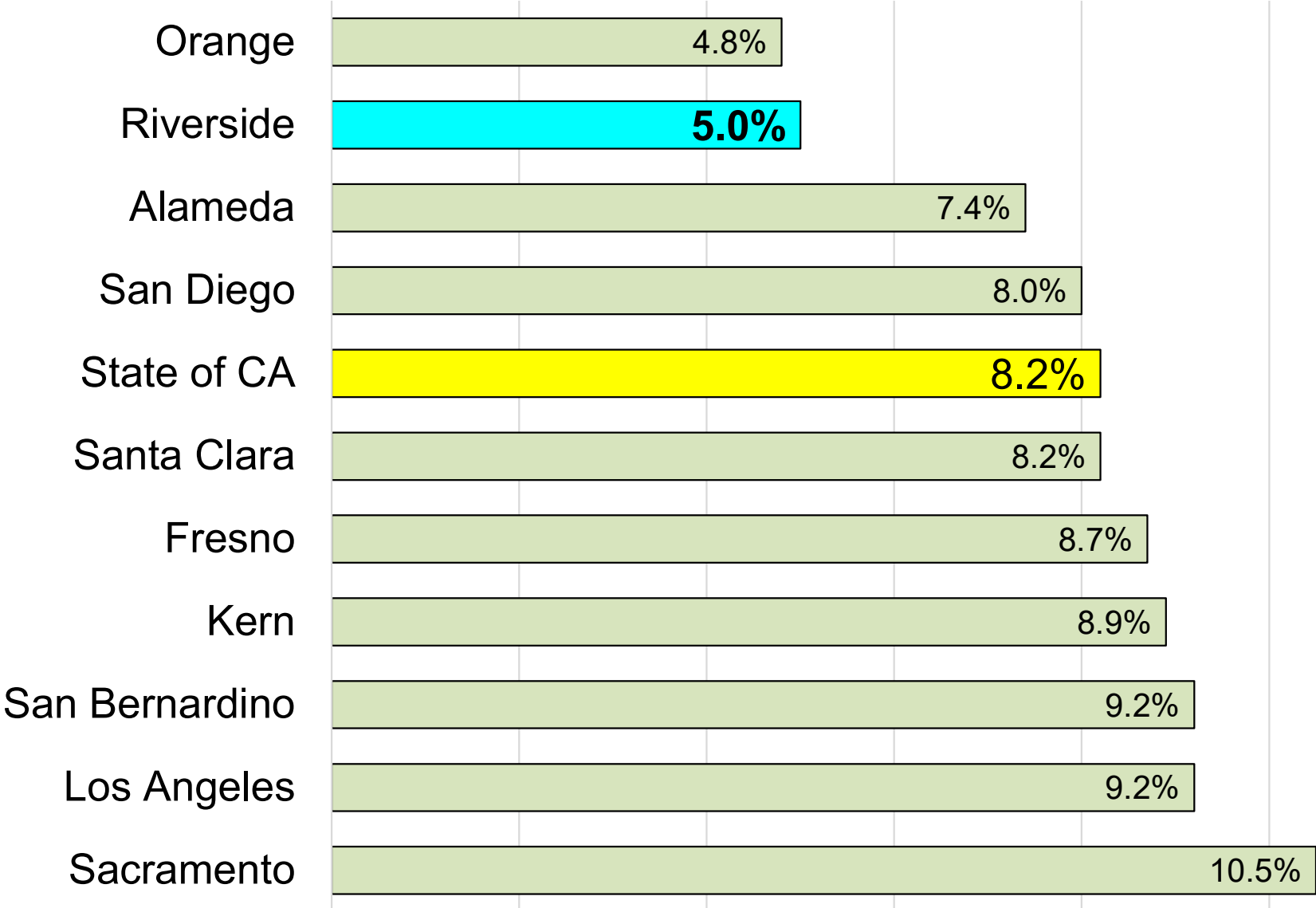

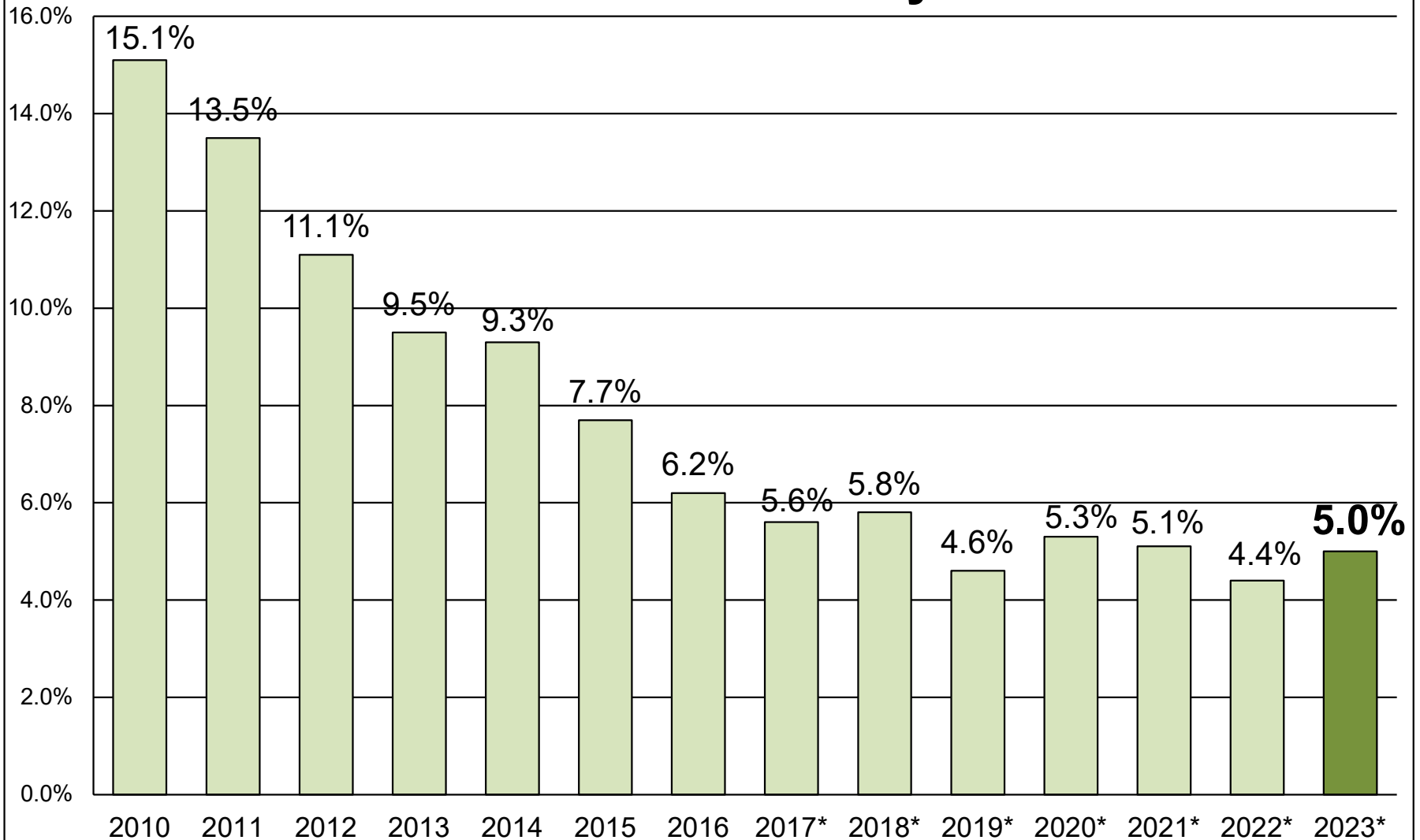

# 2010-2023 Cohort Dropout Rates Riverside County



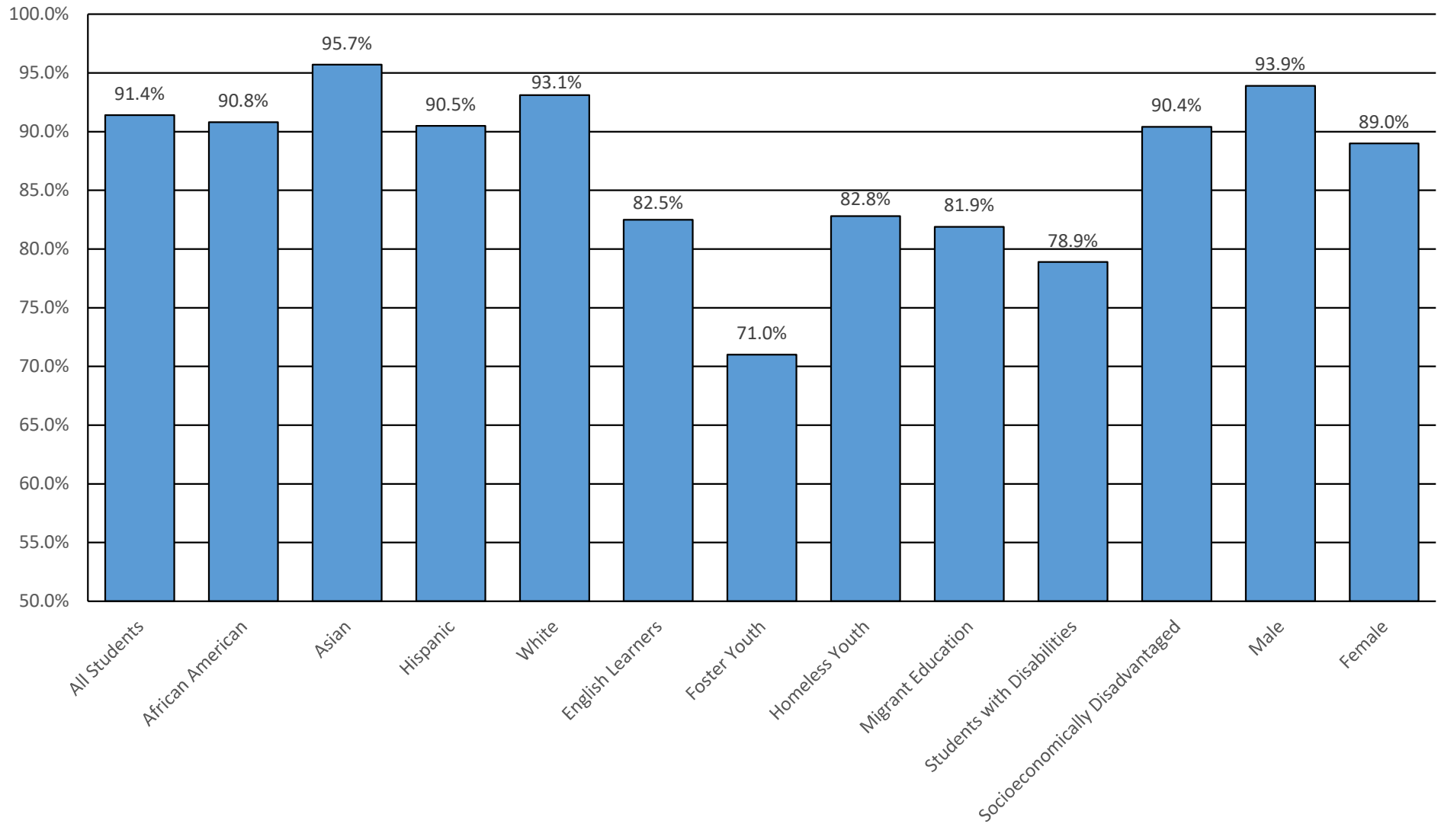

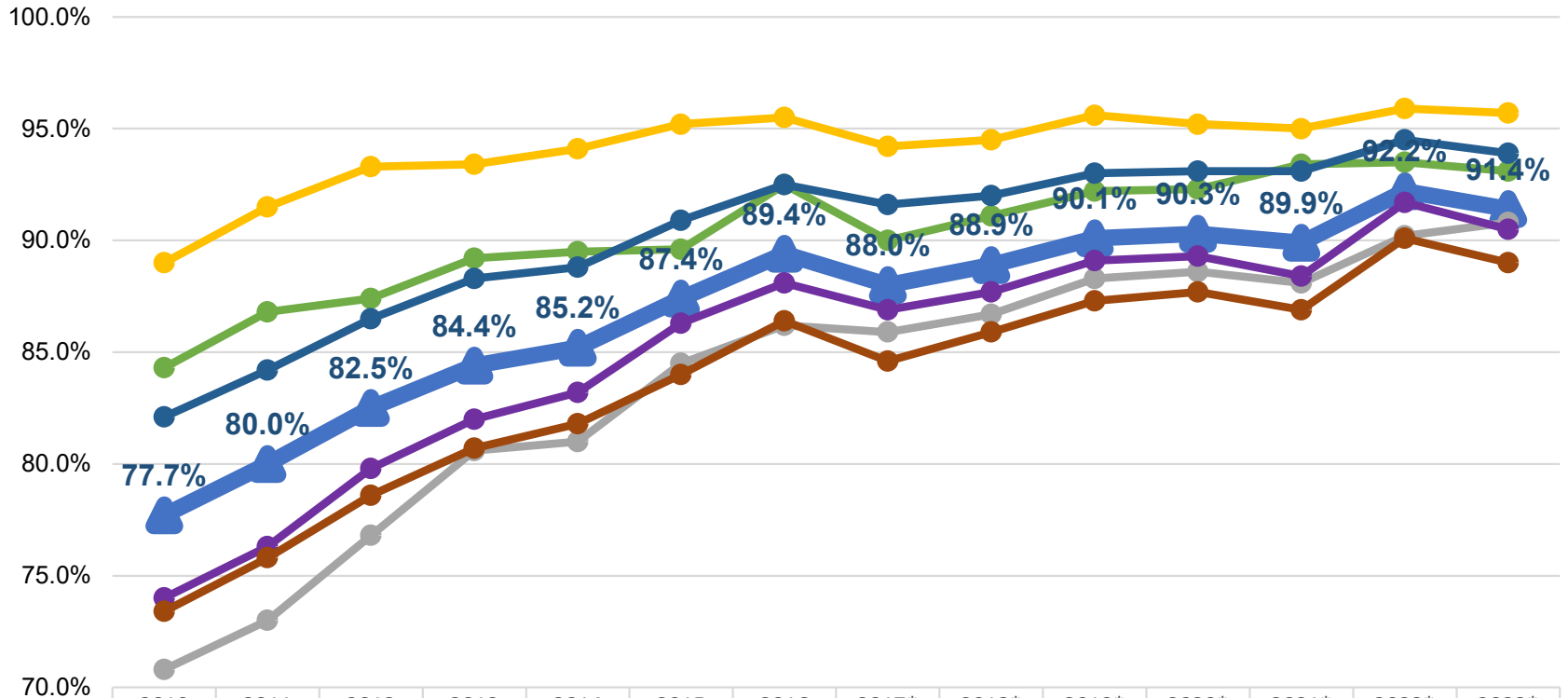

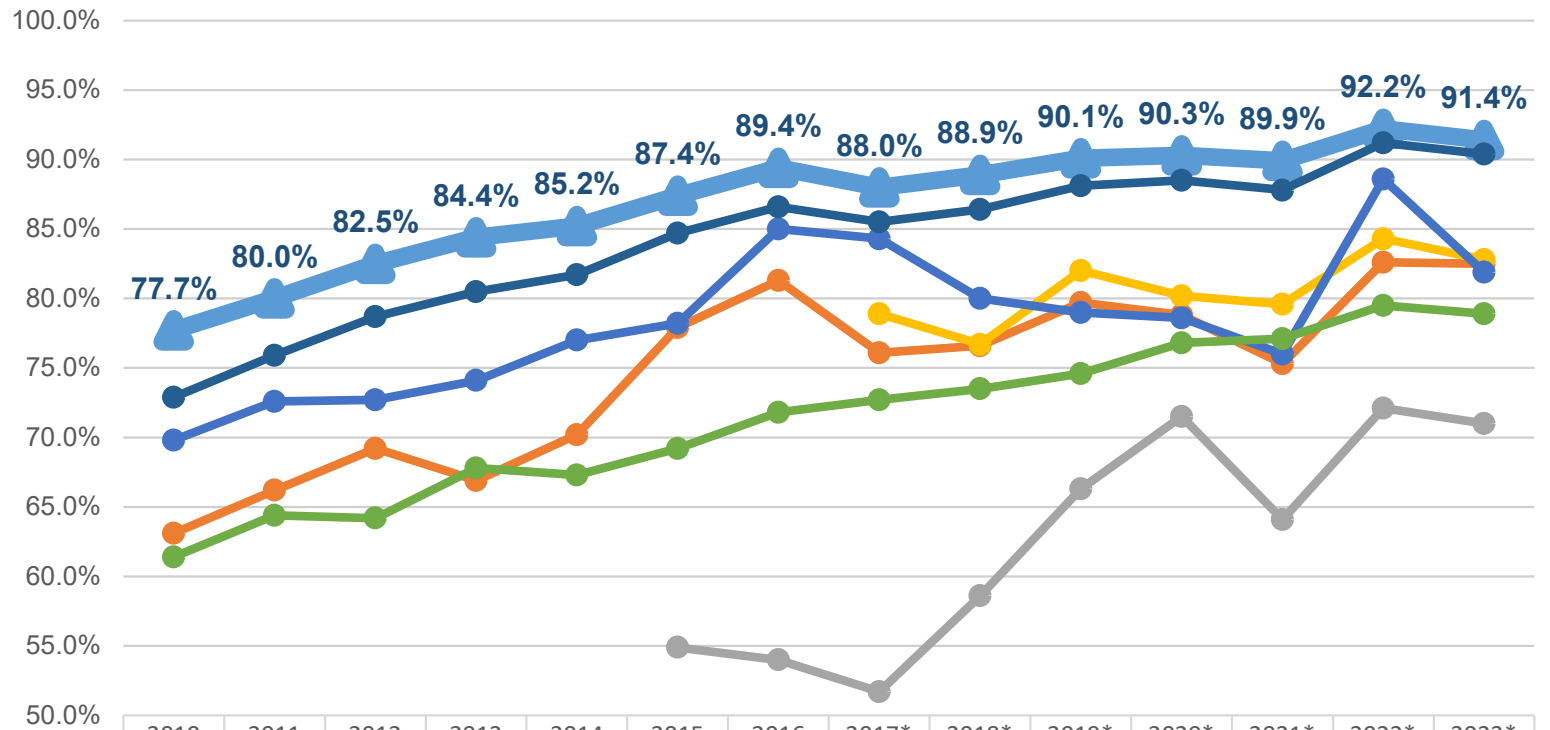

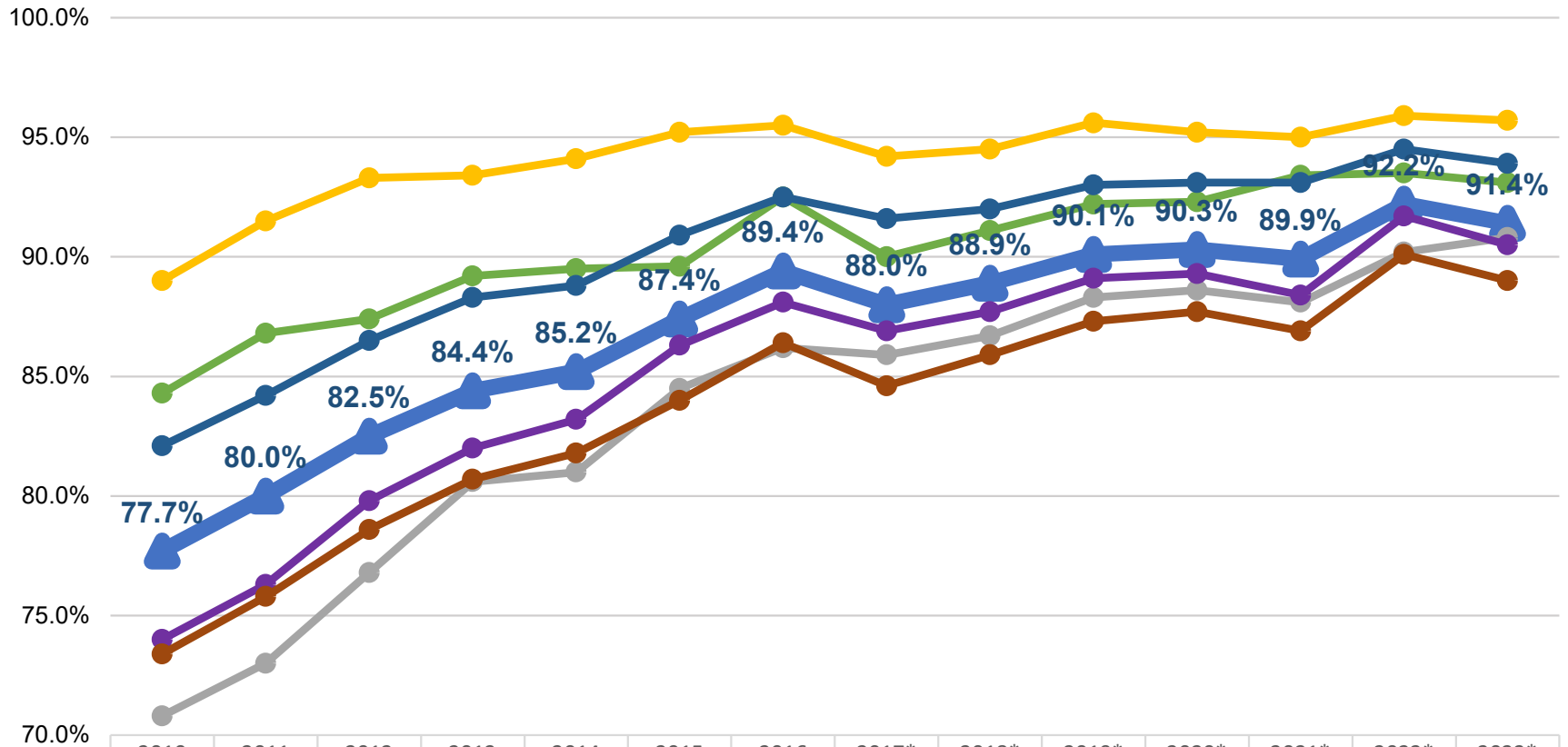

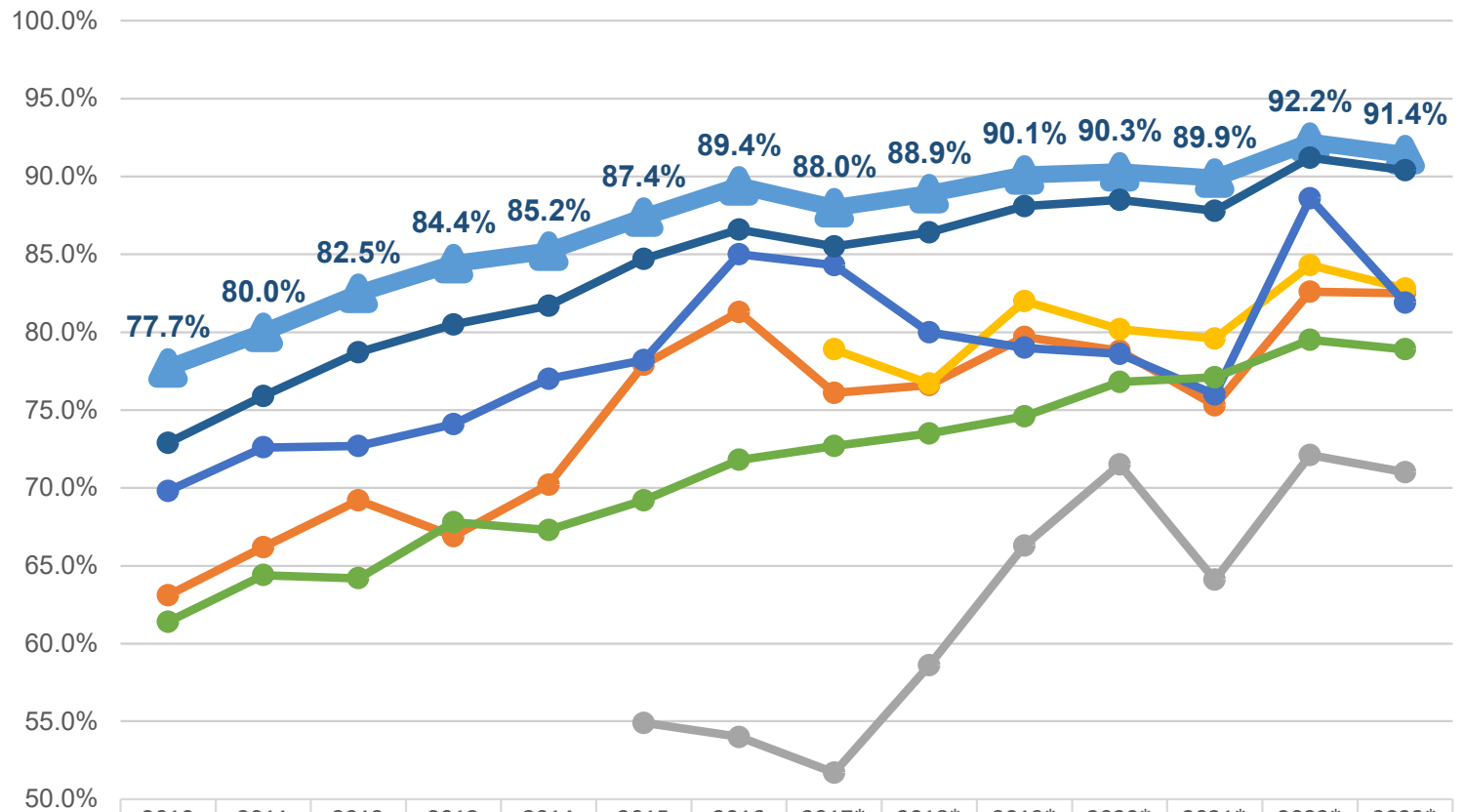

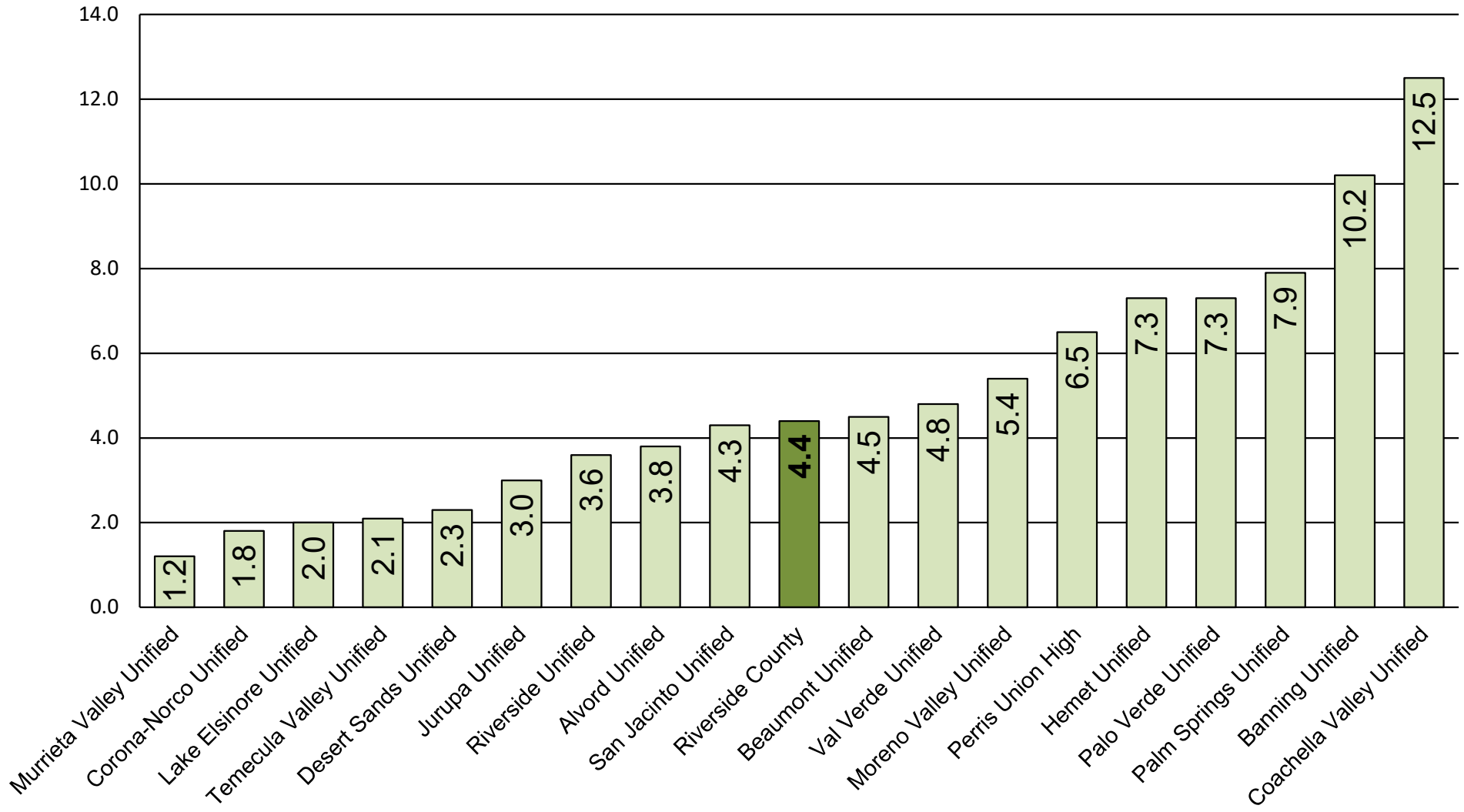

# 2023 Riverside County A-G Completion Rates Student Groups Comparison



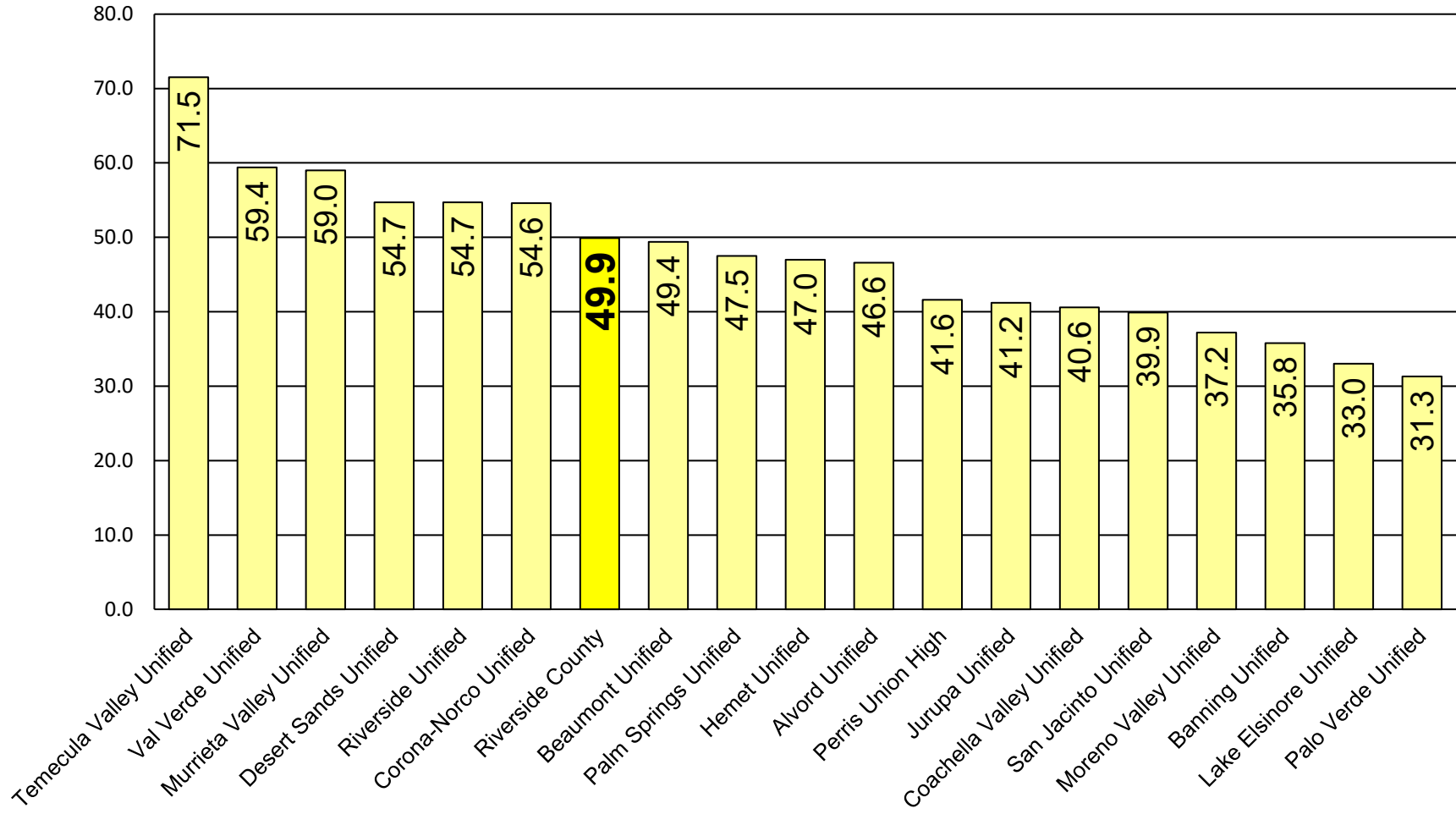

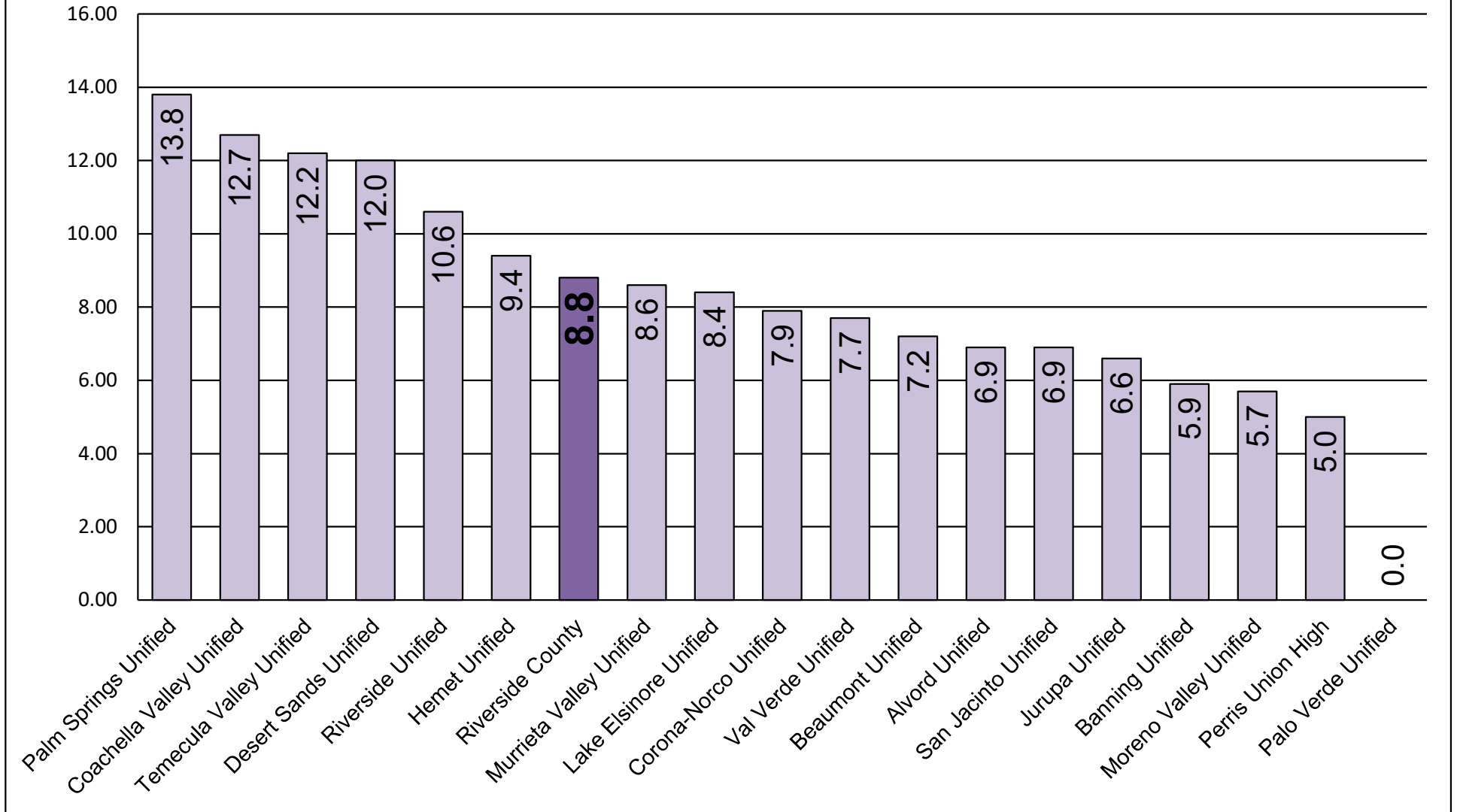
