BOARD BYLAWS

SUBJECT: Governance Standards

The County Board of Education believes that its primary responsibility is to act in the best interests of every student in County Office of Education programs. The County Board of Education also has major commitments to parents/guardians, all members of the community, employees, the state of California, laws pertaining to public education, and established policies of the County Office of Education. To maximize County Board of Education effectiveness and public confidence in the County Office of Education governance, County Board of Education members are expected to govern responsibly and hold themselves to the highest standards of ethical conduct.

The County Board of Education expects its members to work with each other and the County Superintendent of Schools to ensure that a high-quality education is provided to each student. Each individual County Board of Education member shall:

- 1. Keep learning and achievement for all students as the primary focus
- 2. Value, support and advocate for public education

- 3. Recognize and respect differences of perspective and style on the County Board of Education and among staff, students, parents and the community
- 4. Act with dignity, and understand the implications of demeanor and behavior
- 5. Keep confidential matters confidential

6. Participate in professional development and commit the time and energy necessary to be an informed and effective leader

7. Understand the distinctions between County Board of Education and staff roles, and refrain from performing management functions that are the responsibility of the County Superintendent of Schools and staff

8. Understand that authority rests with the County Board of Education as a whole and not with individuals

County Board of Education members also shall assume collective responsibility for building unity and creating a positive organizational culture. To operate effectively, the County Board of Education shall have a unity of purpose and:

- 1. Keep the County Office of Education focused on learning and achievement for all students
- 2. Work collaboratively with the County Superintendent
- 3. Communicate a common vision
